Augusta, GA - Walton Odum Ridgdill, 91, husband of the late Annie Liza Causey Ridgdill, went home to be with his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, on February 14, 2012.

Funeral services will be held at Silvercrest Baptist Church this Friday, February 17, 2012, at 2:00 P.M. with the Rev. John Kilpatrick and Rev. H.G. Ridgdill officiating. Mr. Ridgdill will lie in state at the church from 1:00 until the hour of the service. Interment will follow in Hillcrest Memorial Park.

Mr. Ridgdill, a native of Lyons, GA, was the son of the late Henry Morgan and Lily Mae Meeks Ridgdill. He was a retired mechanic and commercial fisherman, an avid gardener, and he loved music. He helped build the current Silvercrest Baptist Church where he was a member, an original trustee and Sunday School teacher.

He was a proud World War II Veteran, having been a part of the Allied invasion of Normandy, France, in 1944.
