Waynesboro, GA - Edith H. Jones, 98, died peacefully at Ogeechee Area Hospice in Statesboro, Georgia on Sunday, June 18, 2017.

She was born in Lohn, Texas on January 3, 1919 to Sterling Ernest Huie and Rena Lohn Huie. Mrs. Jones was a direct descendant of a pioneer family that founded the Lohn community and lived there until her marriage to George Warren Jones in 1940. She resided in Brady, TX until 2011 when she moved to Georgia to be closer to family. A professional woman, she served as the office manager/secretary of the McCulloch County Farm Bureau for 40 years.

She was preceded in death by her parents, brother, John Huie, and husband of 53 years, Warren, and is survived by son George W.
