Evans, GA - Henry Lewis Quinn, 62, husband of Joy Phillips Quinn, entered into rest Monday, June 25, 2018, at his residence.

Funeral services will be held Friday, June 29, 2018, at 2:00 PM from Wesley United Methodist Church with Reverend Greg Porterfield, The Reverend Doctor John Brown, Reverend Doctor Adam Hilderbrandt, Reverend David Blackwood, and Reverend Susan Gilbert officiating.

Interment will follow in Bellevue Memorial Gardens.

Mr. Quinn, son of the late Augustine Statham Quinn, Jr., and Lois Debus Quinn, was born in Atlanta, and was an educator for 30 years. A member of Wesley United Methodist Church, he served as Chairman of the Church Council. He was also a member of the Cornerstone Sunday School Class, serving as its president.
