Summerville, SC - Nova Marie Cunningham Wylds, 93, wife of the late Charles William Wylds, entered into rest Tuesday, August 30, 2022, at her residence in Summerville, SC

Funeral services will be held Saturday, September 3, 2022, at 11:00 o'clock from the chapel of Chance and Hydrick Funeral Directors with Pastor Barry Clanton officiating.

Interment will follow at Hillcrest Memorial Park.

Mrs. Wylds, daughter of the late James Laurie Cunningham Sr. and Vera Lulline Rhea Cunningham, was born on September 1, 1928, in Lowndes County, Lake Park, GA.

She graduated from Tubman High School for girls in June 1945. She married on April 3, 1953, to the late Charles William Wylds born on April 3, 1930, son of William Albert and Dorothy Swan Beasley Wylds.

Mrs. Wylds was co-founder and charter member of Fleming Christian Church, co-founder, and charter member of Tubman High School Alumni Association. She was a member of First Christian Church and a member of Gracewood Retirees Association. She served on the committee to erect the first monument dedicated to a woman on Greene Street "The Emily Thomas Tubman" monument across from the First Christian Church and parsonage which she built (paid for) in 1976.

She is survived by her children Linda Wylds Easler, Cheryl Wylds Reed and Charles Dwayne Wylds; her 7 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren.

Pallbearers will be Travis Easler, Daniel Reed, Brian Reed, Elliott Wylds, Bob Wylds, Jr and Tyler Reynolds.
