All of these would lead him to the world of golf. Todd became a professional caddie. This took him all over the country and he loved caddying for elite clientele. Todd fell in love with the "Greens": Augusta National, Sage Valley, Congaree, Baltosrol, Trump National, Pro-Am PGA Tournaments, Senior Am Tournament, and Old Chatham. Todd was proud to

have caddied for Joaquin Niemann for four years, who won the Junior Invitational and will be in our own "Masters Tournament" this year. (He also worked as a sales director for Boston Hannan Golf Magazine in Chicago, Illinois.)

Todd had a unique and large personality and loved meeting people. Todd was a tremendous and extremely enthusiastic Georgia Bulldog fan.

Todd leaves behind two beautiful daughters, Addison Powell Smith of Blackshear, Georgia and Mia Arabella Timmerman of LaCross, Indiana; a fiancée', Teresa Brewton; a stepfather, Myron Daniels; stepmother, Judy Farmer; sister, Tracey Redden; brother, Matt Timmerman; "Dad of his heart," Jerry Armstrong, who gave him unconditional love and guidance; Heath Shelton, "Brother of his heart;" his father, Mike Timmerman; and was loved by many cousins.
