Corporal Allen Paul Trego, 71, of Aiken, South Carolina, went to be with his Heavenly Father on Friday, October 3, 2025. Born on June 29, 1954, in Circleville, Ohio.

Allen proudly served his country in the United States Marine Corps, earning the title Marine and achieving the rank of Corporal. During his service, he was awarded the Marine Corps Expeditionary Medal and the National Defense Service Medal and was recognized twice as an Expert Marksman Shooter. His service reflected the values he carried throughout his life- discipline, loyalty, and honor.

Allen studied Business Management at Coastal Carolina. After leaving the Marines, he worked as a construction superintendent and took great pride in building his own home “on the hill,” where he enjoyed gardening and tending to the fruits and vegetables he grew with care. He loved sailing and found peace in the open water, but his greatest joy came from spending time with his family.
