Eugene Mosley, born March 13, 1950, in Emanuel County, Georgia, passed away at PruittHealth–Creekside after a short illness. Eugene was a lifelong Georgian whose warmth, humor, and infectious personality left a lasting impression on everyone who knew him.

Steve Dent's Sunday School class and cherished his church family. Eugene had a passion for baseball, cheering on the Atlanta Braves, and he was an enthusiastic supporter of the Georgia Bulldogs. He enjoyed staying informed and had a genuine curiosity about life and the world around him.

Eugene will be remembered for his joyful spirit, his love of conversation, and the way he made others feel welcome and valued. He was, in every sense of the phrase, a "good egg." His laughter, kindness, and unwavering enthusiasm for life will be deeply missed but fondly remembered.
