After leaving LA County Jail as a Nursing Assistant, Ivett became a motivated, dedicated, and adored Counselor at the San Bernardino County Juvenile Hall. Invested in the lives of our youth and their ability to rehabilitate, Ivett made a difference each and every day on the job! Ivett, destined to succeed in the United States, returned to school and earned her master's degree in social work. After completing her next level of education, Ivett began working as a Social Worker for San Bernardino County. Ivett retired as a cherished Social Worker with San Bernardino County in 1999. Ivett was very influential in connecting crucial branches of our family tree. In a happenstance meeting, Ivett engaged in conversation with a person with a link to the last name Andrews and this led to the introduction of the Finney family. The large Finney clan began from a sister of Ivett's grandfather, extending our knowledge of our already large family. Ivett's discovery paved the way for a reunion of the Finney's and Andrews clans as they reunited at our first New York Family reunion in 1994. Ivett was a huge Los Angeles Lakers fan and never missed a game. She emphatically watched a lot of games with her children and grandchildren over the years. Her curiosity about basketball began with the interest her boys had shown, and she has been hooked ever since. Ivett surprised her grandchildren with her vast knowledge of the sport and team statistics. She also loved watching Track and Field and rooted for Jamaica, West Indies, as the sprinters often made her proud of her birth country. As a woman of Faith, Ivett enjoyed attending church. Ivett was a beloved member of St Andrew Presbyterian Church in Augusta, Georgia. At the church, Ivett served as a Deacon. She was active in Presbyterian Women, the Wednesday night Bible study, visited nursing homes, served in the Gap Soup Kitchen, attended prayer circles regularly, and was the most faithful sender of E-Cards on all occasions to all members whether she knew you or

not. She also called members frequently to check on them. Overall, she was a very active member of St. Andrew and “we will miss her very much”.
